Our Year at a Glance

2015 marked Frontlines 28th year of service to the children and youth in Weston. We were able to celebrate successes, make new plans for our future and face the many challenges of running our programs.

We started the year with a new Director, Cheyanne Smith. Cheyanne had been working at Frontlines as a Program Assistant and Summer Camp Coordinator. We also were the fortunate recipients of a significant donation from the United Church of Canada as a result of the sale of Westminster United Church, a longtime supporter of Frontlines. This donation helped us to start the year on a firm financial platform.

Frontlines was also the recipient of a Youth Skills grant from the Government of Ontario. We were able to extend the Front Burner cooking programming for children and youth into the next phase – Catering Careers. This program was developed by Cavell Hart, our Program Manager. Frontlines would train unemployed youth, aged 18 to 29 who were currently not in school.

Catering Careers was a huge success, with virtually all the program graduates finding full time employment in the hospitality sector.

With Catering Careers running during the day our afterschool programs continued to thrive. We had children learning to cook, to make healthy food choices, to get exercise and to feel welcome and important. The W. Garfield Weston Foundation grant helps to pay for all the food.

We also ran our March Break and Summer Camps at full capacity – with over 60 children participating. We teamed up with St. Andrew's Church to run a youth leadership training program. We also teamed up with Urban Arts for a number of events over the summer.

We continue to struggle with our physical building. The wear and tear is evident after years of exuberant use. Home Depot has supported some renovations, but there is always more to be done.

We are blessed to have a strong donor base, and we continue to reach out to the community and beyond.

Frontlines continues to be a valued asset in Weston, and we look forward to another year of change and growth
