

## Payless Gives Shoes to Frontlines' Kids

TORONTO, Ontario, March 18, 2013 — A group of excited and happy children descended on the Payless Shoe store at Lawrence and Keele recently where they each selected a pair of brand new shoes, using their merchandise certificates awarded by Payless ShoeSource.

This spending spree was made possible through Weston Frontlines Centre (Frontlines), which was selected as an official partner of Payless Gives Shoes™ 4 Kids, an annual giving program from Payless

ShoeSource. Frontlines is among several charitable agencies representing all 50 states in the United States, as well as Canada, Puerto Rico and 11 Latin American countries.

The 23 children, ranging in age from 8 to 14 years, are participants at Frontlines, a non-profit organization that offers after-school programs to children and youth in the Weston community, which is designated as one of the 13 priority neighbourhoods in the City of Toronto.

Frontlines works with over 200 children and youth each year; building impactful relationships with our participants. Although our focus is on children and youth we understand that kids can't thrive in an unhealthy home or community so we also reach out to families and groups to build a strong community. We foster and restore wellness and respect among our diverse neighbours by building relationships and providing programs that address the whole child.

This is the fifth year of the Payless Gives Shoes™ 4 Kids program. Although studies show that properly fitting shoes are important for children's health and development, a striking number of children don't own a pair of shoes that fit. We are working to remedy that here in Toronto.
