#### **Message From Executive Director**

This year was a challenging and transitional year for Frontlines. In my absence for part of 2022 and early 2023, several key relationships with staff, partners, funders, and other stakeholders were impacted. Simultaneously, there were significant investments in the operations of Frontlines to support the growth of the organization. Despite the team's fundraising efforts and operational adjustments, for the first time in 8 years, Frontlines is reporting a deficit. It is a small deficit but one that serves as an indicator for serious decisions to be made for the vitality of Frontlines' future. While the economic climate has resulted in this reality for many non-profits across Canada, it is one that Frontlines has been able to bypass for several years. Now, Frontlines has embarked on a plan to diversify our fundraising efforts to support the growth of this organization. We are thankful to our stakeholders who have stayed with us during this transition.

In juxtaposing the impact of the deficit with the impact that Frontlines has had on the lives of young people, there is truly no comparison. Frontlines had double the number of registrations for our programs. We have expanded our programs not only across Toronto but also across Canada. At the latter end of 2023, Frontlines was notified of an approval from the government of a \$7 million grant, distributed over the next 5 years. This program seeks to address the rise in violence in Toronto and the involvement of racialized and marginalized youth as either victims or perpetrators of crime. This funding allowed for the expansion of Frontlines' efforts to communities across the Greater Toronto Area, including Dorset Park, Regent Park, and the Peel region, through funneling funds to our grassroots partners to do similar work like Frontlines. We were also a recipient of a grant that allowed us to distribute funds to youth all across Canada to run community projects that helped to create a diverse and inclusive Canada.

I am indeed proud of the work of Frontlines. While the work is not easy, it is worth it. The smiles of the young people are worth it. I remember one day in 2023 upon returning, I was dealing with a time-consuming matter with a funder, only to be pulled away to engage in a conversation with a staff member regarding a requirement from a different funder. While heading over to speak to the staff, I saw a young man looking quite distressed on the couch. I walked by the young man and went to speak with the staff. After speaking with the staff, I proceeded to go back to find the young man to inquire about his well-being. Through the conversation with the young man, I learned that he was hungry and was having headaches but was too embarrassed to tell someone. I quickly ran over to the kitchen and asked the staff to prepare a meal for the young man. No youth should go hungry at Frontlines! While waiting on the food, the young man disclosed he had just come out of prison, how he became aware of Frontlines from his friend, and how Frontlines is truly supporting him. After receiving his meal, he turned to me, smiled, and then said, "Thank you, man. Blessings to you." I am proud to say that this young man has a job through one of our amazing employment partners. The smiles are truly worth it.

The work is not possible without the contributions of the dedicated staff members. I cannot express my gratitude enough to them. Similarly, I thank the board members for their contributions to the organization. Together with the staff and the committed board members of Frontlines, I look forward to the future of Frontlines.

#### STAND OUT PROGRAM

In 2023, we welcomed approximately 35 enthusiastic kids per week to our summer camp program, providing them with a vibrant and engaging experience. Throughout the summer, we ensured they were well-nourished by serving approximately 105 nutritious meals to support their growth and energy during their time with us.



## TEEN'S PROGRAM

Frontlines offers dynamic after-school programs tailored to teens, running from 4pm to 6pm. These programs provide a supportive environment where teens can engage in a variety of enriching activities, from academic support to recreational pursuits. In 2023, we welcomed in over 30 teens into our What's On My Plate culinary program, cooking over 50 meals for the year. Throughout the W.O.M.P program we ensure that teens are learning new cooking recipes to develop their culinary skills and engaging in mental health topics that will encourage teens to advocate and seek appropriate support within Frontlines when needed.

#### STAND OUT PROGRAM

In 2023, a total of 148 individuals successfully completed the F.E.E.T program. Additionally, 94 people completed their placements, with 19 of those completing the placement as part of the YIB program. Furthermore, 26 participants graduated from the YIB program.

#### YOUTH IN THE BLACK: FINANCIAL LITERARY

In 2023, Frontlines successfully ran two cohorts of our Financial Literacy Program tailored for young adults aged 16-29, primarily Black youth from the Little Jamaica community. Over the course of 8 weeks, participants attended in-class training sessions where they received compensation for their attendance. Through these sessions, they delved into essential topics such as saving, budgeting, accounting, life insurance, generational wealth creation, investing, and debt and credit management, among others. This program was made possible through a partnership with the City of Toronto, underscoring our commitment to empowering youth with vital financial knowledge and skills.



After completing the intensive 8-week in-class training at Frontlines for our Financial Literacy Program, participants transitioned into a placement phase where they applied their newfound knowledge in real-life scenarios. This placement opportunity provided invaluable hands-on experience, allowing participants to put their financial literacy skills into practice and gain practical insights into various financial contexts. Through engaging with real-world challenges and responsibilities, participants further reinforced their understanding of financial concepts and developed crucial problem-solving abilities. The placement phase not only complemented the theoretical learning from the classroom but also empowered participants to navigate and thrive in diverse financial environments confidently.




